FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Nur-ul-Ilm – 34th Edition

It is with great pride and gratitude that I pen this message for the 34th edition of our school magazine, Nur-ul-Ilm. This year has been truly historic for Nadi Muslim College, marked by remarkable achievements in academics, sports, community engagement, and development. Together, we continue to live by our motto: "Knowledge is Light."

Our College Community

Nadi Muslim College now caters to 967 students across 27 streams: six streams each in Years 9 to 12, and three streams in Year 13. These learners are guided by 53 dedicated academic staff and 7 ancillary staff, including two Alimah teachers who provide Islamic and moral guidance. With approximately 1,000 people directly engaged in daily school life, NMC has become one of the leading educational institutions in the Western Division.

Flagship Project – The New School Hall

Our Flagship Project, the new Multipurpose School Hall (50m x 20m x 6.1m), has taken shape and stands as a symbol of progress and unity. This project, costing close to \$500,000, is being completed in phases with steel frame, roofing, sports flooring, stage, and washroom facilities. It is being funded by the collective effort of our parents, ex-scholars, management, sponsors, and the Fiji Muslim League. The groundbreaking ceremony was officiated on 3rd July 2025 by the Minister for Education, Hon. Aseri Radrodro, during our school carnival. The completion and grand opening is scheduled for 29th November 2025, coinciding with the Nadi Zone Quran Awards. This hall will serve not only as a school facility but also as a community hub, an evacuation centre during disasters, and a venue for outreach, examinations, and sports.

Sports and Extracurricular Highlights

Nadi Muslim College has had an extraordinary year in sports and co-curricular activities:

- **Rugby:** Our Under-17 Rugby Team were crowned Champions of the Fiji Muslim Sports Association Tournament, a first for NMC, bringing immense pride to the school and community.
- **Soccer:** Our ICC Under-17 Team reached the grand final and finished as Runners-up, losing narrowly on penalties – an achievement that showcased our strength and fighting spirit.
- **Netball:** Our girls continued their dominance, with U-14, U-17, and U-19 teams winning district and zone championships, lifting the profile of netball at NMC.
- **Boxing:** Several of our students, such as Ubaidullah Naumaan Ali (Year 1006) and Aron Balack (Year 1206), proudly represented the College in Blue Water Promotions at King Charles Park.
- **Athletics:** Strong representation at the Coca-Cola Games highlighted the depth of our sporting talent.
- **IT and Innovation:** Our students participated in Information Technology competitions, showcasing creativity in coding, design, and digital solutions.
- **Oratory Competitions:** Notably, Tanzeelah Tahira Sadiq (Year 1004) won 1st Prize in the Oratory Contest at the Ministry of Agriculture Show, earning \$100 and a framed certificate – another milestone in public speaking and leadership.

Community Engagement – CAPS & Carnival

Our Community Outreach Programs (CAPS) have strengthened ties between school and home, with regular parent meetings for Years 9–13. These sessions emphasized discipline, attendance, project completion, and exam readiness.

The Annual Nadi Muslim College Carnival (3rd–5th July 2025) was a massive success. With sponsorships, voluntary \$oli contributions from 27 class streams, ex-scholars, rides, food stalls, and entertainment, we raised funds exceeding \$250,000, ensuring Phase 2 of the Hall construction could begin. This event also brought together our entire community, with the presence of dignitaries, business leaders, and parents.

Student Discipline and Development

The College has placed strong emphasis on discipline, punctuality, attendance, grooming, and student welfare. Counselling sessions, behaviour contracts, and parental engagement have been key strategies. While challenges such as vaping, absenteeism, and late arrivals exist, they have been met firmly with counselling, warnings, and in some cases suspension – all in line with MOE Behaviour Management Policy. At the same time, positive behaviour and leadership are being nurtured through prefect training, Quran awards, and student development programs.

The Way Forward

As we prepare for the close of 2025, with final examinations ahead, I call upon our students to remain disciplined, hardworking, and committed to excellence. Our future vision includes:

- Completion of the Flagship School Hall.
- Stronger academic results in Year 12 and Year 13.
- Further sports development in rugby, soccer, and netball.
- Greater engagement in IT, innovation, and leadership programs.
- Continued strengthening of community partnerships.

On behalf of the staff and management, I sincerely thank all stakeholders—students, parents, teachers, ancillary staff, alumni, the Board of Governors, the Fiji Muslim League, and the Ministry of Education—for their steadfast support.

Indeed, 2025 has been a year of unity, resilience, and progress. May Allah bless our efforts as we continue to build a legacy of excellence for the generations to come.

The Mathematics and Physics Department is pleased to present its report for this academic year. It has been a year of both progress and challenges, and we are proud of the effort and dedication shown by our teachers and students.

One of the key highlights has been the implementation of the new syllabuses for Years 9 to 12. This required a great deal of preparation, planning, and adjustment from the teachers. Despite the demands of the transition, the department has worked tirelessly to ensure that lessons are delivered effectively, and that students are able to adapt to the changes with confidence.

For Year 13, we successfully introduced project-based learning for the first time. This initiative has provided students with opportunities to apply mathematical and scientific concepts to practical, real-life situations, helping them to develop deeper understanding, critical thinking, and problem-solving skills.
